Member Responsibilities Neighborhood Watch



- 1. Know your neighbors
- 2. Work with your neighbors on community-related problems
- Have your neighbors watch your home when you are away.
- 4. Watch your neighbor's house when they are away.
- 5. Be alert! If you see or hear something suspicious, report it to the police. Since you know your neighborhood better than anyone, if something appears unusual, it should be considered suspicious. Be the eyes and ears of the Centerville Police Department.
- 6. Learn what information the police need when you contact them regarding crimes or suspicious activity.
- 7. Talk to the youth in your neighborhood and become acquainted with them.
- If you witness children misbehaving, take whatever appropriate action is necessary to resolve the matter. Report it to the children's parents, the Centerville Police Department, or if the child is known to you, talk to them personally.
- 9. Be open-minded if you hear complaints about your own children.
- 10. Know as much about your community as possible.
- 11. Get to know new neighbors and invite them to join Neighborhood Watch.
- 12. Know when neighbors move away and let you coordinator know.
- 13. Assist your coordinator in having Neighborhood Watch meetings and/or block parties.
